- The commissioning of 4 Solar Audio Posts (Listening Posts) with recordings relating to the history and life at Colebrook from representatives of the Tjitji Tjuta. Local schools together with artist Carly Dodd have decorated the posts
- The celebration of the extension of the car park, new shelter sheds and Reconciliation Circle
- Displays, including Doris Kartinyeri's Book "Bush Games & Knuckle Bones" if completed
