

STATEMENTS AND PROFILES

South Australia was the first state to introduce the idea of attainment levels for students. In 1990, other states and territories became interested and work started on the National Statements and Profiles.

What are the Statements and Profiles?

Statements and Profiles are documents, developed at a National Level that focus on what all students should *KNOW*, *UNDERSTAND* and *BE ABLE TO DO*. They provide a common framework for reporting on student achievements for Years 1 to 10. They are set out into 8 Areas of Study, namely:-

- * English
- * Studies of Society and
- Environment

 * Health and Physical
- Education
- * Maths
- * Science
- * The Arts
- * Technology
- * LOTE German

A Statement is written for each of the 8 Areas of Study and describes:

The area of learning covered

The range of experiences students should have in that area of study

Statements cover the content and processes involved.

A Profile is written for each Area of Study and describes:

The achievements or outcomes students can achieve.

All staff at Eden Hills are currently involved in developing an understanding of Statements and Profiles, with a particular emphasis on Mathematics. Over the next few weeks, I hope to provide you with more information about the Statements and Profiles, what they mean for students, parents and teachers and what the information collected will be used for.


